
WHEREAS, the Travis County Commissioners' Court has unanimously approved submission of the grant application to the Texas Auto Theft Prevention Authority, and

Dear Judge Doerfler:

As you know Governor Bush has declared Williamson County a natural disaster area due to the recent devastating storm. His action enables us to take some action relating to the property taxes on the damaged property, if authorized by our taxing units.

I have enclosed a copy of the section of the Texas Property Tax Code that addresses what can be done to provide some property tax relief for those that have suffered these terrible losses.

This section of the law would allow us to reappraise the damaged property at its value immediately after the disaster as well as the value as of January 1st. Then the taxes would be prorated on those two values. This reappraisal will be a significant undertaking for us in addition to our current work but we are dedicated to providing this service for our community, if the taxing units authorize us to move forward. We will do our best to do the additional appraisal within our current budget.

If your taxing unit wants to authorize us to do this reappraisal we need to know as soon as possible in order for us to get it done prior to time for your tax rolls.

Please let us know your decision as soon as possible.
