WHEREAS, Charles Fuller has dedicated his life to law enforcement, setting the standard for public service in cooperation, honesty, courtesy and service; and

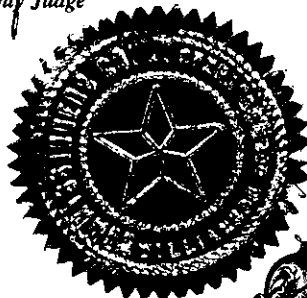
