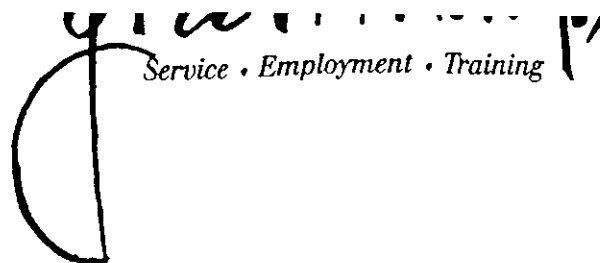

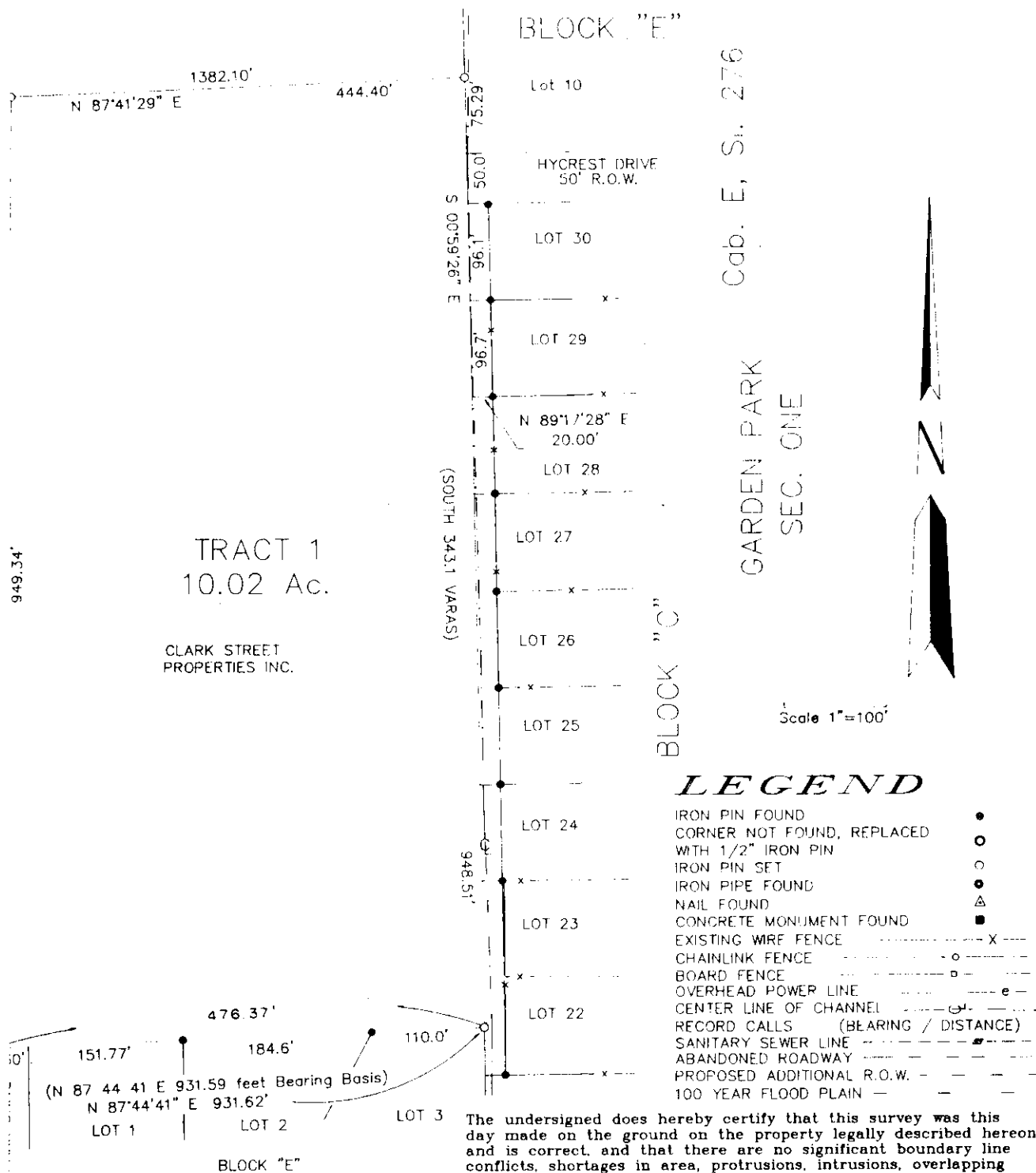

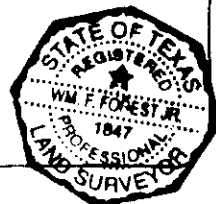

Re: Subdivision Opinion

Dear Ms. Sell:

On Tuesday, April 1, the Williamson County Commissioners Court considered the proposed division of the 30 acre tract north of Lone Star Business Park and Tradesmen's Industrial Park. They determined that this division would not require the filing of a subdivision plat under certain conditions. Each of the new tracts, and each of the existing lots in the two subdivisions that will be linked to them, must be placed under restrictive covenants filed with the County Clerk in the Real Property Records. These covenants must state that each of the new tracts is to remain permanently associated with the adjacent lot. Neither the tract nor the lot may be separately sold without the other (unless the two are split by the filing of a subdivision plat approved by the proper authority).

If the restrictions are duly executed and filed, the commissioners court will consider both the new tracts and the old lots to be in compliance with the Williamson County Subdivision Order. They will be "legal lots," eligible to receive septic tank permits, utilities, and other services.

Several months ago, June Lykes with the Wallace Group presented a proposal to the Court to provide a map of the county with overlays that provided various information such as city limit boundaries CCN's, population projections, etc. The Court authorized spending \$7500 on this mapping project. When we received a copy of Wallace's proposed contract, concerns were expressed by County staff persons familiar with these mapping issues. Evidently, much of what the Wallace Group is agreeing to provide us under this contract is information that we already possess.

At your request, I researched this proposal and asked knowledgeable staff to make suggestions as to what information we need, find out what we have and to make recommendations as to how the project from the Wallace Group could be beneficial to the County. Joe England set up a meeting with Pam Orr, the GIS/mapping manager with the appraisal district, Hugh Bender, assistant director of planning with the City of Round Rock, Emily Stulka and representatives from Cedar Park, Georgetown, and CAPCO. The consensus at this meeting with regard to the proposed contract was that while the county and other governmental entities in the county have most of the data that Wallace proposes to provide, no one has compiled this data in one place. The mapping folks agreed that the provisions of Attachment A would be most beneficial IF this data was overlaid on the same base map that ALL of these agencies use.

Evidently, Wallace intends to overlay the data on an unrectified photograph. If the data is simply overlaid on such a photo, it will be of marginal use to the staff and its use to the Court will be limited. The mapping folks recommend that we use maps provided by the Texas Digital Ortho Quarter Quad Project(DOQQ's) These are the photos which the appraisal district, 911 addressing, our engineer and these other entities use. These photos can be provided to Wallace at no cost. If the Wallace group would use this base, then the data they provide will have value and applicability; further, it will be a tool we can use in the future whereby staff can input additional data and update these maps in-house.

Bottom line-- governmental agencies and departments in the county have most of the information that Wallace wants to provide us. Basically, this is an information compilation and merging project. This compilation will be useful to us, I am told, if the data is compiled on the same base used by these different agencies.

I spoke with Mr. Lykes yesterday. He said that he believed that the technical staff was trying to kill the project. He emphasized that he wants these maps to be a planning tool. They will not be accurate, ^{but} they will provide rough estimations of these boundary lines. He wants to provide the Court with a visual aid and, hopefully, in the process, land a planning consulting deal.

I have attached suggested revisions to the contract submitted by Wallace. These suggestions are made as to the substance matter of the contract, no legal analysis has been made nor is any intended. I will only say that their "fine print " page is hooey and should not be included. and I will also say that some of their language is vague and problematic. Let me know if you would like me to do anything further on this matter.

STANDARD PROVISIONS OF AGREEMENT
FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

The Client and Engineer agree that the following provisions shall be part of their agreement.

1. Neither the Client nor Engineer shall assign its interest in this agreement without the written consent of the other.

2. All agreements on Engineer's part are contingent upon, and Engineer shall not be responsible for damages or be in default, or be deemed to be in default, by reason of delays in performance by reason of strikes, lock-outs, accidents, acts of God and other delays unavoidable or beyond Engineer's reasonable control, or due to shortages or unavailability of labor at established area wage rate or delays caused by failure of Client or Client's agents to furnish information or to approve or disapprove Engineer's work promptly, or due to late or slow, or faulty performance by Client, other contractors, or governmental agencies, the performance of whose work is precedent to or concurrent with the performance of Engineer's work. In the case of the happening of any such cause of delay, the time of completion shall be extended accordingly.

3. In the event that any changes are made in the work performed hereunder, by the Client or persons other than Engineer, which affect Engineer's work, any and all liability arising out of such changes is waived as against Engineer and the Client assumes full responsibility for such changes unless Client has given Engineer prior notice and has received from Engineer written consent for such changes.

4. Engineer is not responsible, and liability is waived by Client as against Engineer, for use by Client or any other person of any data, reports, plans or drawings not signed by Engineer.

5. All tracings, survey notes, and other original documents are instruments of service and shall remain the property of Engineer, except where by law or precedent these documents become public property.

6. Engineer's liability to the Client for injury or damage to persons or property arising out of work performed for the Client and for which legal liability may be found to rest upon Engineer, other than for professional errors and omissions, will be limited to \$1,000,000. For any damage on account of any error, omission or other professional negligence Engineer's liability will be limited to a sum not to exceed \$50,000 or Engineer's fee, whichever is greater.

7. Fees and all other charges will be billed monthly as the work progresses, and the net amount shall be due at the time of billing.

8. All invoices not paid within 30 days are subject to the following schedule: Interest of 1 1/2% per month shall be payable on any amounts not paid within 30 days.

9. The Client shall pay the costs of checking and inspection fees, zoning and annexation application fees, assessment fees, soils engineering fees, soils testing fees, aerial topography fees, and all other fees, permits, bond premiums, title company charges, blueprints and reproductions, and all other charges not specifically covered by the terms of this agreement.

10. In the event all or any portion of the work prepared or partially prepared by Engineer is suspended, abandoned, or terminated, the Client shall pay Engineer for the work performed on an hourly basis, not to exceed any maximum contract amount specified herein.

11. Any Opinion of the Construction Cost prepared by Engineer represents his judgement as a design professional and is supplied for the general guidance of the Client. Since Engineer has no control over the cost of labor and material, or over competitive bidding or marketing conditions, Engineer does not guarantee the accuracy of such opinions as compared to contractor bids or actual cost to the Client.

12. The Client agrees that in accordance with generally accepted construction practices, the construction contractor will be required to assume sole and complete responsibility for job site conditions during the course of construction of the project, including safety of all persons and property and that this requirement shall be made to apply continuously and not be limited to normal working hours.

13. In the performance of its professional services, Engineer will use that degree of care and skill ordinarily exercised upon similar conditions in similar localities and no other warranties, expressed or implied, are made or intended in any of Engineer's proposals, contracts or reports. The Client agrees to defend, indemnify and hold Engineer, its consultants, agents, directors, officers and employees, harmless from any and all claims, damages, losses, expenses and liability, real or alleged, in connection with the performance of work on this project, excepting liability caused by the sole negligence of Engineer.

14. For services involving or relating to hazardous materials, it is further agreed that the Client shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless Engineer and its consultants, agents, directors, officers and employees from and against all claims, damages, losses and expenses, direct and indirect, and consequential damages, including but not limited to fees and charges of attorneys and court and arbitration costs, arising out of or resulting from the performance of the work by Engineer, or claims against Engineer arising from the work of others, related to hazardous materials to the fullest extent permissible by law, regardless of any action or omission (active, passive or comparative negligence included) on the part of Engineer. The above indemnification provision extends to claims against Engineer which arise out of, are related to, or are based upon, the actual alleged or threatened discharge, dispersal, release, saturation or escape of pollutants, and any directive to test for, monitor, clean up, remove, contain, treat, detoxify or neutralize pollutants. "Pollutants" means any solid, liquid, gaseous or thermal irritant or contaminant, including smoke, vapor, soot, fumes, acids or alkalis, chemicals and waste.

15. It is further agreed that the Client shall indemnify and hold harmless Engineer and its consultants, agents, directors, officers and employees from and against all claims, damages, losses and expenses, direct and indirect, and consequential damages, including but not limited to fees and charges of attorneys and court and arbitration costs, arising out of or resulting from the performance of the work by Engineer, or claims against Engineer arising from the work of others, related to asbestos activities, to the fullest extent permissible by law, regardless of any action or omission (active, passive or comparative negligence included) on the part of Engineer. "Asbestos activities" means any specification of, other use of, or exposure to material or process containing asbestos, failure to detect the existence or proportion of asbestos in a product, material or process and the performance or failure to perform abatement, replacement or removal of a product, material or process containing asbestos.

16. In the event Client fails to pay Engineer within thirty (30) days after invoices are rendered, then Client agrees that Engineer shall have the right to consider said default a total breach of this agreement and the duties of Engineer under this agreement terminated upon five (5) days written notice. This agreement may be terminated by either Client or Engineer upon thirty (30) days written notice in the event of substantial failure of the other party to perform in accordance with the terms of the agreement. Client expressly agrees to hold Engineer harmless from any liability arising out of Engineer's termination of its services hereunder due to Client's failure to perform and/or pay in accordance with the provisions of this agreement. In the event of termination of this agreement, Client shall then promptly pay Engineer for all of the fees, charges and services performed by Engineer in accordance with the compensation arrangement under this agreement or on an agreed hourly basis.

17. Should litigation be necessary to enforce any term or provision of this agreement, or to collect any portion of the amount payable under this agreement, then all litigation and collection expense witness fees and court costs, and attorney's fees shall be paid to the prevailing party.

18. Should any provision herein be found or deemed to be invalid, this agreement shall be construed as not containing such provision and all other provisions which are otherwise lawful shall remain in full force and effect, and to this end the provisions of this agreement are declared to be severable.

19. Engineer will be totally indemnified on all certifications which are required to be signed on behalf of the client during the course of the project.

20. Services provided within this agreement are for the exclusive use of the Client.

21. The Client acknowledges that it has secured legal rights in the property upon which the project will be built or that such right will be secured by _____. 19 _____. The Client further acknowledges that non-payment of fees owed under this agreement will result in a mechanics lien being placed on the property upon which the project is/will be located.

22. There are no understandings or agreements except as hereinafter expressly stated.



COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEM INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT

THIS INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT for a radio communications system is made and entered into effective this April 1, 1997, by and between WILLIAMSON COUNTY; the CITY OF GEORGETOWN; and the CITY OF ROUND ROCK; all of which are political subdivisions of the State of Texas.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Texas Codes Annotated, Chapter 791, the Texas Interlocal Cooperation Contracts provides that any one or more public agencies may contract with each other for the performance of governmental functions and for the joint use of facilities or services for the promotion and protection of the health and welfare of the inhabitants of this State and the mutual benefit of the parties; and

WHEREAS, each of the parties hereto requires a radio communications system with the capability of communicating within the Williamson County, Texas, area on a regular basis; and

WHEREAS, all parties continue to incur considerable costs in maintaining radio communications systems for their daily use; and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to share in the design and establishment of a county-wide integrated radio communications system; and

WHEREAS, designated staff members of the parties have met periodically together with designated staff representatives of other political subdivisions located within Williamson County which all share common interests in the development of an integrated radio communications system and have formed the COUNTY WIDE INTERAGENCY COMMUNICATION SYSTEM, herein referred to as "CWICS" consisting of representatives of all participants in this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the above-mentioned meetings have resulted in agreement on certain areas of common concern, including the need to establish a governing body, administrative procedures, and financing activities.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, the parties agree as follows:

I. DEFINITIONS:

1. Board - Two (2) representatives and one (1) alternate from each public agency signing this agreement. Each representative shall be appointed by the governing body of the respective Party.
2. CWICS - County Wide Interagency Communication System Organization, which is a group of representatives from the Parties to the Agreement.
3. Equity Owner - any entity other than a Party or a User. Any participant with a population of 5,000 or over, according to the most recent federal census, must be an Equity Owner.
4. Party - the initial signers of this Agreement.

5. RF Backup Site - a site located at the Williamson County Maintenance Facility. This site will have seven trunking channels that are connected to the Smart Works Controller which will be located at the RF Main Site.
6. RF Main Site - the Georgetown SMR site, which shall have ten 100 Watt QUANTAR 800 MHZ repeaters. A 14 channel SmartNet Central Controller will be used for systems control. The existing SmartWorks controller and the five MSF 5000 repeaters will be relocated to the RF Backup Site. The equipment at the RF Main Site will use the existing antenna system. CWICS, as defined above, will not have to provide any antenna equipment at this site.
7. Site Cost - cost of operation and maintenance of equipment for each tower site.
8. System - two RF sites that operate in a main-backup mode. There will be three main dispatch centers with a total of twelve CRT dispatch positions. The System uses the Georgetown SMR site as the RF Main Site. The RF Backup Site will be located at the Williamson County Maintenance Facility. System does not include mobile or portable radios or mobile or radio phones.
9. System Cost - the cost of operation and maintenance of all equipment plus the cost of administration in operating the system generally used every time a two way RF call is made on the system.
10. User - any entity other than a Party or Equity Owner which participates in this agreement. Only entities with a population of 5,000 or under, according to the most recent federal census, may be Users.

II. ORGANIZATION

1. BOARD REPRESENTATION: The business and affairs of CWICS shall be conducted by a board consisting of two (2) representatives and one (1) alternate from each Party signing this Agreement. Each representative shall be appointed by the governing body of the respective Party, with one representative being a member of the Police, Fire, or other public safety department of the governmental agency.
2. MEETINGS: The time and place of regular meetings of the Board shall be determined by the Board, but the Board shall meet not less than once every three months. The chairperson of the Board may also call a meeting whenever he/she deems necessary. If the chairperson is unable or unwilling to call a meeting upon request of a representative of one of the Parties, a meeting may be called by any two Parties to this agreement.
3. QUORUM: A quorum shall exist for the purpose of conducting the business and affairs of CWICS if one or more representative or alternate from each of the Parties that signed this Agreement are present at a scheduled meeting. Each Party is entitled to one (1) vote. The vote of the majority of a quorum is necessary for the Board to take any action.
4. OFFICERS: CWICS shall elect a chairperson, a vice chairperson, and a secretary for a one year term. Elections of officers shall be held annually during the first week in October or as soon as possible thereafter.
5. SECRETARY: The secretary shall be responsible for keeping the minutes of all of the meetings of CWICS and all other official records.
6. BOARD RESPONSIBILITY: The Board's primary responsibilities shall be the review, oversight, and operation of all aspects of the System shared by all Parties to this Agreement. The costs, expenses, and responsibilities which are considered to be shared

are those incurred for the benefit of all parties to this Agreement and include, but are not limited to, the following:

- a. Utilities and maintenance of the RF Main and RF Backup Sites.
 - b. Maintenance and repairs of system equipment at the RF Main and RF Backup sites.
 - c. Review of the operations of the system as a whole, and
 - d. Other approved shared costs.
7. JOINT APPROVAL: The following matters involving the operation and cost are subject to joint approval of the Board and each Party (governmental agency) including all items related thereto:
- a. Goals and objectives of the entire communications system
 - b. Operating procedures and policies
 - c. Budgets and expenditures, prepared in a line item format
 - d. Acquisition, possession, leasing, encumbrance, and disposal of personal and real property
 - e. Facilities improvement
 - f. Costs of system hardware and software maintenance
8. BUDGET: Prior to June 1st of each year, the Board shall submit a tentative budget to the respective governmental entities for their approval.
9. EXPENDITURES AND REIMBURSEMENT: Any expenditures which exceed the annual approved budget of CWICS must be approved by the governing body of each Party to this Agreement. No Party nor CWICS may receive reimbursement for an expenditure unless it receives approval from the governing body of each Party to the Agreement, which approval shall be obtained prior to the acquisition of any equipment or any service.
10. COST REVIEW: The Board shall review the costs and expenses of operating, maintaining, and repairing the System on a quarterly basis. Upon approval of the Board, these quarterly costs and expenses will be apportioned among the users and CWICS shall invoice each user for their proportionate share of the costs.
11. PAYMENTS: Payment to CWICS shall be made within thirty (30) days of receipt of invoice.
12. ADMINISTRATION: The operation and maintenance of CWICS facilities and equipment shall be conducted and/or administered by the Board.
13. DISPUTE SETTLEMENT: Should any dispute arise between any Parties concerning the terms of this Agreement, the dispute will be presented for resolution to CWICS. A two-thirds quorum of the above stated CWICS may act to resolve any such issues. The decisions of CWICS shall be binding on all Parties. If for some reason, a quorum cannot resolve the issue, then the Board will retain a certified mediator to mediate a resolution to the conflict.

III. SYSTEM RADIO CAPACITY

1. ORIGINAL UNITS: The RF Main Site shall include ten (10) repeaters with a minimum of one thousand (1,000) unit allocations.
2. UNIT ALLOCATION: One unit allocation is considered to be either one mobile radio, one hand held portable radio, or one control station. The initial allocation shall each be as follows:
 - 1) City of Georgetown - 333 units
 - 2) City of Round Rock - 333 units
 - 3) Williamson County - 333 units

Any initial Party may request the CWICS Board to review the unit allocations based upon the population of the service area and the number of radios needed for basic service. Unit allocations will be revised in this Agreement with each System upgrade.

3. AVAILABLE ALLOCATED UNITS: Should any Party have more unit allocations than is required at that time for their use, any other Party may request and receive on loan an amount up to all available unit allocations without being required to purchase any additional system equipment. At such time as the lending Party requires additional capacity, the borrowing Party shall make the borrowed unit allocations available to the lending Party within ninety (90) days of the notification of the need to increase the System capacity. If no unit allocations are available for loan by any other Party, any Party requiring additional unit allocations and system capacity shall purchase the necessary additional system equipment to increase the system capacity by the required number of additional unit allocations.
4. SYSTEM UPGRADE: When the capacity of the system is increased to meet the needs of one Party, that Party is solely responsible for the cost of acquiring a new frequency and the repeater for that frequency. All other System upgrade costs for shared resources and equipment will be divided equally among the Parties to the Agreement.

IV. OWNERSHIP OF EQUIPMENT

1. EQUIPMENT LIST: Each Party shall retain ownership of any equipment purchased by that Party, even though installed at either the RF Main Site or the RF Backup Site. A list of all equipment owned by each Party at the signing of this Agreement is attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit "A".
2. ANNUAL LIST: Prior to June 1, each Party shall submit annually to the CWICS Board a list of all separately owned equipment.
3. EQUIPMENT AT SITE: The equipment located at each of the sites shall be shared by all Parties. The CWICS Board shall approve any additional equipment added to the system prior to its purchase and addition to the system.
4. DISPATCH: Dispatch facilities and field user equipment may be co-owned by two or more Parties or purchased and owned separately by any Party.
5. SYSTEM ASSETS: Ownership of any item of equipment acquired for use in the operation of the system shall remain with the Party purchasing such equipment, if purchased solely by that Party. If purchased with joint funds of the Parties, ownership shall be divided among the purchasing Parties in the proportion that each Party contributed toward the purchase.

6. **DISPOSITION AT TERMINATION:** Upon the withdrawal of any Party, the Party withdrawing shall request the remaining Parties to purchase the withdrawing Party's interest in jointly owned equipment at the rate of the purchase price minus any depreciation and abnormal damage, if any. Should the remaining Parties not wish to purchase the withdrawing Party's interest in any jointly owned equipment, such equipment shall be disposed of as provided in Article 4413 of the Texas Revised Statutes, as amended, and the proceeds divided among the Parties in proportion to their original contribution.

V. MAINTENANCE AND COSTS

1. **UNSHARED EQUIPMENT:** Each Party to this Agreement shall be solely responsible for the maintenance of their own dispatch facilities, field user equipment, telephone lines, microwave links, long distance phone calls, mobile and portable equipment, etc., or any other such equipment acquired solely for the benefit of the individual Party. If any equipment or other facilities are co-owned by two or more Parties, those Parties shall be solely responsible for agreeing to a procedure for allocating maintenance costs between themselves. Any service other than routine maintenance and repair shall obtain Board approval. Board approval is not needed for emergency maintenance and repairs.
2. **SHARED EQUIPMENT:** The recurring monthly costs for the operation and expenses for maintenance of the RF Main Site and the RF Backup Site, equipment, utilities, telephone lines, insurance, or other costs incurred solely for the benefit of all Parties to the Agreement shall be allocated based on the number of field subscriber units owned by each Party. The expenses are summed monthly and then divided by the total number of field subscriber units on the system. The resulting figure is the cost per subscriber unit for the billing period. This cost figure is then multiplied by the number of field subscriber units a Party has on the system for that billing period. This method of allocation shall be reviewed annually by the board of CWICS.
3. **LINE ITEM AMOUNTS:** All accounts exceeding \$1,000 shall have an appropriate line item justification schedule attached.
4. **REVENUES:** Any grants or revenues derived from providing service to any other agency or organization shall be applied against the cost and expenses prior to any apportionment.
5. **SHARED COSTS:** Costs and expenses, if any, which are considered to be shared are those incurred for the benefit of all the Parties including, but not limited to the following:
 - a. utilities and maintenance of the remote communications sites that are deemed to be an integral part of the system
 - b. maintenance of System equipment
 - c. authorized capital expenditure
 - d. repairs to the System, and
 - e. other approved budgeted categories necessary for the operation of the System
6. **INDIVIDUAL COSTS:** Each Party shall bear its own costs of service of equipment that is incurred solely for the benefit of an individual Party, i.e. telephone lines to individual stations, long distance phone calls, etc.

7. **OVERRUNS:** Any expenditure which exceeds the annual approved budget must be approved by the Board subject to the operational guidelines within each Party's jurisdiction.
8. **PURCHASE AND CONTRACTS:** All matters of acquisition and contracts shall be in accordance with Article 4413(32c) of the Texas Revised Statutes, as amended.
9. **REIMBURSEMENTS:** No Party may receive reimbursement for an expenditure for the costs unless it receives appropriate approval from the other Parties for that expenditure.

VI. ACCOUNTING

1. **BOOKS:** Complete books and accounts shall be maintained for CWICS in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and standards, including compliance with all applicable statutes and regulations. Annual financial reports will be completed by an auditor approved by the Parties.
2. **ACCOUNTING REVIEW:** An accounting review of all funds and accounts of CWICS related expenses shall be conducted annually. The review must cover the business of CWICS during the full fiscal year, which runs from October 1 to September 30. The audit shall be made by a public accountant certified or registered by a partnership or professional corporation registered under the provisions of Article 1528e of the Texas Revised Statutes, as amended. Such financial audit shall be conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards.

VII. PARTICIPATION BY OTHER GOVERNMENTAL ENTITIES

1. **ADDITIONAL USERS:** Any governmental entity that desires to become an approved User of the system must apply in writing and receive the approval from the CWICS Board stating the name of the entity, the type of use requested, and the quantity of each type of use. No additional User to the System will have a vote in any decision by the CWICS Board.
2. **REQUIRED CAPACITY:** Notwithstanding the above, no additional User may be accepted until and unless there is sufficient capacity to add additional radios to the System.
3. **COSTS:** All additional Users will thereafter be subject to the same shared costs as stated in section V, above.
4. **EQUIPMENT UPGRADES:** Additional Users participating in this Agreement shall purchase all equipment needed to upgrade the System as directed by the CWICS board. All additional equipment purchased by Users shall be owned by the Parties.
5. **EQUITY BUY IN:** Any governmental agency with a population of 5,000 or over, according to the most recent federal census, must participate as an Equity Owner. An Equity Owner to this Agreement will be required to pay an "equity buy-in" fee as set by the Board of CWICS at the time the new agency joins the Agreement. Upon joining the Agreement, the new agency will be subject to the same annual user fee based on allocated field subscriber units used by the agency. The equity buy-in of the System may be based on the current replacement value of the System plus the initial cost of the study and design of the System less any unpaid debt divided by the proportionate capacity that the new agency will use in the System. No refund or rebate of equity buy-in moneys or user fees will be available to the new agency once the new agency has placed radios in use on the System. No Equity Owner will have a vote in any decision by the CWICS Board.
6. **EQUITY BASIS:** Equity basis is total cost of system.

7. ALLOCATION OF BUY-IN FEE: At the time of buy-in by an additional Party, a resulting credit will be included in the periodic billing calculation for the existing Parties.

VIII. DURATION

This Agreement shall be effective on _____ and shall continue in force and effect until _____ and shall continue as a yearly contract until terminated by the Parties as provided in Section IX and X.

IX. TERMINATION

1. RIGHT TO WITHDRAW: Any Party to this Agreement has the right to withdraw from this Agreement by providing express written notice which must be received by the other Parties one hundred eighty (180) days prior to October 1st of each year.
2. JOINT EQUIPMENT: Equipment purchased with joint funds of the Parties shall remain on the site, and the terminating Party shall be reimbursed for its share of the equipment purchased with joint funds. The reimbursement shall be the original cost less depreciation, as determined by an auditor jointly selected by the Board and the Party withdrawing from the Agreement. Should either the terminating Party or the Board dispute the value, the disputing Party shall, within forty-five (45) days of notice of disagreement to the other Parties, employ an appraiser of its choice who shall determine value through the same means. If the value as determined by the second appraiser is within fifteen percent (15%) of the first appraisal, the cost shall be determined by averaging the two appraisals. If the value difference is greater than fifteen percent (15%), and the parties are unable to negotiate a value, the two appraisers shall select a third appraiser who shall determine value by determining the original cost less depreciation to establish a value. Payment shall be an average of the two lowest appraisals. Reimbursement shall occur within twelve (12) months of the final appraisal determination in any case.
3. SEPARATE EQUIPMENT: The terminating Party may remove any and all of its own separate equipment, unless the removal of the equipment will render the System inoperable. In such case, the Party may not remove the equipment, but shall be reimbursed pursuant to Section IX.2, above.

X. MISCELLANEOUS

1. SEVERABILITY: The Parties agree that in the event any provision of this Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be in contradiction of any laws of the State or the United States, the Parties will immediately rectify the offending portions of this Agreement. The remainder of the Agreement shall be in full force and effect.
2. ENTIRE AGREEMENT: This agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties hereto, and supersedes all their oral and written negotiations, agreements, and understandings of every kind. The Parties understand, agree, and declare that no promise, warranty, statement, or representation of any kind whatsoever, which is not expressly stated in this Agreement, has been made by any Party hereto or its officer, employees, or other agents to induce execution of this Agreement.
3. CHOICE OF LAW: This Agreement shall be performable in Williamson County, Texas.
4. AMENDMENT: This Agreement may be amended by unanimous vote of the CWICS Board if said proposed Amendment is ratified and approved by the governing body of each Party.
5. ASSIGNMENT: Except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, the rights and duties of the Parties may not be assigned or delegated without the written consent of all the

Parties to this Agreement. Any attempt to assign or delegate such rights or duties shall be consistent with the terms of any contracts, resolutions, indemnities, and other obligations of this Agreement. This Agreement shall inure to the benefit of, and be binding upon, the successors and assigns of the Parties.

6. NO PERSONAL BENEFIT: No Party intends to benefit any person who is not named as a Party to this Agreement, to assume any special duty to supervise the operations of another Party, to provide for the safety of any specific person or to assume any other duty other than that imposed by general law.
7. NOTICE: Any notice give hereunder shall be in writing, and may be effected by personal delivery, or by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, at the address of the respective Parties indicated below:

8. PARAGRAPH HEADINGS: The various paragraph headings are inserted for convenience of reference only, and shall not affect the meaning or interpretation of this Agreement or any section thereof.
9. ATTORNEY FEES: In any lawsuit concerning this Agreement, the prevailing Party/Parties shall be entitled to recover reasonable attorneys fees from the nonprevailing Party/Parties, plus all out-of-pocket expenses such as deposition costs, telephone calls, travel expenses, expert witness fees, court costs, and other reasonable expenses.
10. COMPLIANCE WITH APPLICABLE LAWS: The Parties hereby agree to comply with all ordinances laws, rules, regulations and lawful orders of any public authority. Specifically, nothing in this Agreement is intended to conflict with the City of Georgetown's zoning, franchise or health and safety authority.

Additional Work Required for the MPEC and Surrounding Development

REQUESTED WORK

Sources of Funding

It is now time to put together a "big picture" of most the sources of funding for the proposed CDD. This will include, but not necessarily be limited to the following projections and estimates:

- The cash flow from MPEC
- The sales tax from MPEC
- The sales taxes from retail establishments in the CDD
- The occupancy tax from hotels/motels in the CDD
- The sales tax from the water park, movie theater, and amphitheater

This will be done on an annual basis for the years 1997 through 2003.

Pieces of this overall estimation of income for the proposed CDD have been done in the past. However, only the income from MPEC has been annualized. A more careful analysis of the profile of retail establishments will be made. Estimations of start-up times will be made as well as growth projections of tax revenues by retail establishment.

This analysis will be based on the present (10/8/96) configuration of the proposed CDD.

In addition, we will examine the possible benefits to tax increment financing. And, we will estimate the increases in ad valorem taxes as a result of the improvements to the land within the proposed CDD.

Our fee for this project is \$4,000. It will take two weeks to complete.

CDD Implementation

For a district to be created, all landowners within a proposed district must agree to and petition for the creation of the county development district. The petition must include:

- the proposed boundaries of the district;
- the name and the number of the district;
- the names of five people willing and qualified to serve as temporary directors;

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- a description of the proposed project;
- the estimated cost of the project; and
- a statement indicating why the district is necessary, how it is feasible and whether it will attract tourism.

The landowners must sign the petition and file it with the commissioners court.

Within 60 days after the county receives the petition for creation of the district, the commissioners court must post notice for and hold a hearing to grant or to refuse the petition.

If the commissioners grant the petition, the temporary board must hold an election within the boundaries of the proposed district to confirm the district's creation and to authorize the sales and use tax within the district. If the commissioners deny the petition, they must do so by order. The commissioners court must appoint a temporary board of directors who will conduct the election.

We will perform all the work necessary to coordinate and/or generate the information to create the land owner's petition, and we will write the petition. We will also create a plan for the implementation of the CDD up to the election.

Our fee for this project is \$3,000. The schedule for completion of the project depends upon the conduct of a survey and creation of metes and bounds, and the acquisition of all the land that will make up the proposed CDD.

CDD Tracking

Indications are that CDD activity state wide is going to increase. In addition, there may be changes proposed to the CDD Act in the next legislature. It is imperative that Williamson County, because of its dependence on the CDD Act, monitor activity statewide in the application of the CDD Act. In addition, the county should become involved in the communication process surrounding revisions to the CDD Act. The combination of these two activities will give Williamson county advance warning on the issues likely to affect the future of the CDD Act and its use for the MPEC and surrounding development.

We will monitor via newspaper articles any uses of the CDD Act. We will also meet with, and continue to stay in touch with some of the key administrative and legislative contacts important to the CDD Act. We will advise Williamson county of any progress or proposed changes to the CDD Act. There will be no charge for the monitoring activities. If any proactive work is required, we will make a proposal for our involvement.

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PROPOSED WORK

Master Project Plan

The proposed CDD project needs to have a master plan that indicates:

- All the key events in the initial phases of the project
- The interdependencies of the events
- The sequencing of the events

This will enable the team of county, developers, and commercial interests to understand the scope and sequencing of work required for a successful project. The plan will also facilitate discussions among the team of issues that need to be resolved as well as identifying new issues. The plan can also be used as a benchmark to track progress of the project.

The planning process will be iterative. An initial plan will be developed and used as a vehicle to facilitate discussion on the project with the team members. The plan will be reviewed at least monthly and updated as needed to reflect new realities.

The plan will be developed from the county's perspective. It will help the county protect its interests in the project.

The initial project plan, done at a very high level, will require a week to complete. Our fees for the plan are \$3,000. Updates, tracking, and modifications will be done monthly at a cost of \$2,000 per month. This fee will hold until the project requires more than several days of our time per month.

Additional Requirements for the Exposition Center

Recent decisions to move the headquarters and manufacturing facilities for both the Dell Computer Company and Power Computing into Williamson County brings additional opportunity to the MPEC Exposition Center that must be investigated. It may be possible through capabilities of the Exposition Center to meet corporate needs for these companies for exhibits, demonstration, conference and education requirements that would not have to be incorporated into their facilities. The needs of these two companies can not only increase the demand for usage of the Exposition Center it can potentially add new uses. These new uses could demand additional features such as an auditorium, which in turn could be used for cultural events as well.

We will locate and meet with the appropriate people within these two companies and solicit detailed requirements and discuss potential trade-offs between County and Corporate facility assets.

This activity will take three weeks at a cost of \$2000.

MPEC Not-for-Profit Corporation

In addition to the CDD Board, MPEC is going to require the formation of a not-for-profit corporation established to ensure the effective and efficient operation of the

center, oversee operations and protect the interests of the community. To assure that this corporation is set-up in the best possible manner and have the best board appointed, the following should be accomplished:

- Establish best practices of similar corporations within the state
- Create qualifications for board membership
- Establish operating procedures and by-laws

The results of this study can then be used to select and appoint board members and write the by-laws of the organization. This project will minimize the county's legal expenses in setting up the corporation.

This project will require a month to complete. Our fee for the project is \$6,000.

Community Involvement

To assure unqualified support of MPEC and the CDD, the county should begin a process of communication to business and community leaders within the county. In this project, we would:

- Prepare a presentation on MPEC and the CDD -- This would include slides of similar facilities, and presentation materials on the MPEC programming, financial potential, and economic impact. In addition we will introduce the concepts of the CDD to the business and community leaders.
- Make a presentation to the Chambers of Commerce of each of the five major cities in the county

This project will take four to six weeks to complete. Our fee for the project is \$4,000.
