**AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE CITY OF CEDAR PARK AND WILLIAMSON COUNTY FOR PARTICIPATION IN AND FUNDING OF THE WILLIAMSON COUNTY HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION SCHEDULED FOR SPRING 1997**

The City of Cedar Park ("City") hereby elects to participate as a "Local Sponsor" in the Williamson County Household Hazardous Waste Collection ("Collection") to be financially coordinated by Williamson County ("County"). The City further agrees to pay \$5,000 for the collection by April 25, 1997, in advance of the Collection. In the event unused funds remain after the Collection, the remaining funds will be used for additional projects in Williamson County related to Household Hazardous Waste Collection and/or Management.

The County agrees to be the entity responsible for taking all actions necessary to cause the Collection to be conducted, for the management and disbursement of Collection funds and will use its best efforts to complete the Collection by June 1, 1997.

The obligations of the City and the County under this Agreement are contingent upon the County, (i) being able to enter into a contract with a professional hazardous waste management company for the collection, packaging, transportation, and disposal of household hazardous wastes related to the Collection, (ii) being able to receive approvals for the Collection from the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission; and (iii) being able to enter into agreements similar to the Agreement with other Local Sponsors.

In the event that the Collection is not held by July 1, 1997, this Agreement is null and void and your contribution will be returned.
