Precinct #3 Justice of the Peace Jim Bitz addressed the court expressing appreciation for all the wonderful help received beginning Tuesday, May 27, 1997, with the aftermath of the devastating tornado which destroyed the Double Creek Estates subdivision west of Jarrell, the touch down at 183 and the subdivision of Buttercup Creek in Williamson County.

He asked for prayers for the families of the 27 (the youngest of which was 6 years of age) who lost their lives as well as those hospitalized.

Judge Bitz also suggested children below driving age be finger printed with one set filed in a safe place.

Charles Anderson advised Stockton Auctioneers, Inc. of Jarrell will hold an auction at 1 p.m. on Saturday, June 7, 1997, for any donated items for the benefit of the victims.

Tax Assessor-Collector Deborah Hunt announced the application for and receipt of almost \$29,000.00 in federal flood control funding available every year through the State Controller's Office.

Williamson County will receive \$5,400.00 and Thrall Independent School District, Georgetown Independent School District, Taylor Independent School District and Granger Independent School District will divide approximately \$23,600.00.

Mrs. Nettie Brown, President of the Northridge Acres Home Owners Association, addressed the court regarding the long awaited step project which plans are now proposing to locate the sewer lines on the back side of the lots. She requested the help of the court to have the plans changed back to running the lines on the front of the lots.

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Commissioner Heiligenstein proposed a meeting for Friday, June 6, 1997, for all the home owners, county administrators, County Engineer, Department of Housing and Community Affairs, James Conquest and the engineering firm.

Eileen Hager was introduced as the new director of the Humane Society.

Jarrell resident Fred Mull advised the court of the necessity of road repairs in the Jarrell area.
