The following residents of Hidden Meadow Drive are requesting the Williamson County Commissioners to erect signs to prohibit parking during school hours 9-4 for the addresses 10108 - 10115. And, No Parking at anytime for 75' on the west side of Hymeadow from the southern corner of Hidden Meadow and Hymeadow Drives. We are requesting whatever is necessary to have this enforced by the Williamson County Sheriff's Department. The reasons for restricting parking are as follows:

1. Cars parked on both sides of the street close to the corners restricts access of Emergency Vehicles.
2. Because of the narrow street and parked cars, residents have had near accidents. Cars cannot pass each other. Awkward for disposal and delivery trucks.
3. Because of the isolated area, students are congregating before school, at lunch time and after school. They have been observed by residents using illegal drugs and smoking. This situation has become a serious problem since the new No Smoking Law which was put into effect since January 1, 1998.
4. Residents property and street is always littered by students.
5. Students' cars have blocked residents mail boxes and driveways.
6. Students cross through yards instead of using the street.
7. No parking on Hymeadow as stated above because vehicles turning left onto Hymeadow from Hidden Meadow must enter half way into the intersection to see traffic coming from their right. Extremely dangerous before and after school.

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PROCLAMATION OF
APRIL AS FAIR HOUSING MONTH

WHEREAS Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968, as amended, prohibits discrimination in housing and declares it a national policy to provide, within constitutional limits, for fair housing in the United States; and

WHEREAS The Principle of Fair Housing is not only national law and national policy, but a fundamental human concept and entitlement for all Americans, and

WHEREAS The thirtieth anniversary of this National Fair Housing Law, during the month of April, provides an opportunity for all Americans to recognize that complete success in the goal of equal housing opportunity can only be accomplished with the help and cooperation of all Americans.

NOW, THEREFORE, WE, the Commissioner's Court of Williamson County, do proclaim April as Fair Housing Month in the County of Williamson and do hereby urge all the citizens of this locality to become aware of and support the Fair Housing law.
