

Clarify 1.22 acres from Marjorie Stromberg was bought in error and landowner wants land back and will reimburse Williamson County for same.

Commissioner Mehevec advised error in field notes for deed conveying 1.16 acre corner which Mrs. Marjorie Stromberg was never in agreement to selling to the county and was not aware she had until she attempted to sell the corner which she no longer owned.

A current survey is being accomplished which appears to total 1.16 acres sold to the county in error - Williamson County purchased and paid for 2.15 acres in warranty deed dated March 27, 1997, and recorded on April 4, 1997, in Document #9714530.

First Assistant County Attorney Dale Rye advised if a determination can be made that an error occurred in the original field notes a correction deed could be recorded in the real property records of the office of Williamson County Clerk.
