

I have discussed this matter with John Willingham, Human Resources, on October 13, 1998. He advised that I meet with Dale Rye, Assistant County Attorney, to seek out the legalities and any possible conflicts which may have existed with the Fair Labor Standards Act. Ms. Akers and myself met with Mr. Rye on October 21, 1998, at 4:00 p.m.

I explained to Dale my wishful intentions. Dale reviewed the Fair Labor Standards Act and concluded that Ms. Akers providing deputy service under the color of "Volunteer Service" would be acceptable and within the guidelines of the law. Further discussion over the matter led to limiting Ms. Akers normal duty to her present clerical responsibilities. Hence, she would no longer serve civil process at the office during her normal working hours, nor would she operate any county patrol vehicles during this time. Ms. Akers has already undergone the required civil process training as mandated by JCLEOSE.
