**RESOLUTION**

**WHEREAS, the citizens of Williamson County value clean and healthy air; and**

**WHEREAS, Williamson County dedicated to providing a clean environment for its citizens; and**

**WHEREAS, in July 1997, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency adopted new national ambient air quality standards for ozone, which provide greater protection for public health and welfare; and**

**WHEREAS, ozone levels in Williamson County during 1995-97 exceeded the allowable concentrations under the new EPA standard; and**

**WHEREAS, actions which reduce emissions of ozone-causing pollutants may have other environmental and health benefits, such as reduced fine particulate levels and reduced emissions of greenhouse gases; and**

**WHEREAS, Williamson County is a member of the Board of Directors of the Clean Air Force, an non-profit public-private organization dedicated to developing innovative solutions for healthy air in Central Texas; and**

**WHEREAS, the Clean Air Force has developed a flexible, voluntary, and broad-based Early Action Plan that uses market incentives to encourage individuals and organizations to measurably reduce emissions of air pollutants which case ozone;**

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF WILLIAMSON COUNTY, that the county will support the implementation of the Early Action Plan and work with the Clean Air Force to publicize the Early Action Plan, publicly recognize entities that make emissions reductions under the Plan and promote its implementation by other public and private entities in Central Texas.**
