AGENDA ITEM # 18May 26, 1998Hear report from County Engineer pertaining to ATS Master Plan and consider authorizing a public posting for citizens notice.

County Engineer Joe England distributed memorandum indicating 14 incomplete ATS roadways. He also advised of complaints from various neighborhood associations in Williamson County who had not been informed when they purchased property located near dead-end roads and undeveloped tracts that those tracts were planned for future development with road extensions.

Mr. England proposed developers be required to post signs similar to those of TxDOT (indicating street maintenance) advising the future street extension. Also discussed was the possibility of adding this requirement to Williamson County subdivision regulations.

County Road Superintendent Greg Bergeron addressed the court regarding the proposed new EPA storm water regulations and a TAC sponsored meeting at 10 a.m. on Tuesday June 2, 1998. Mr. Bergeron advised counties would have the responsibility of inspecting for compliance of the new regulations at quite an additional expense.

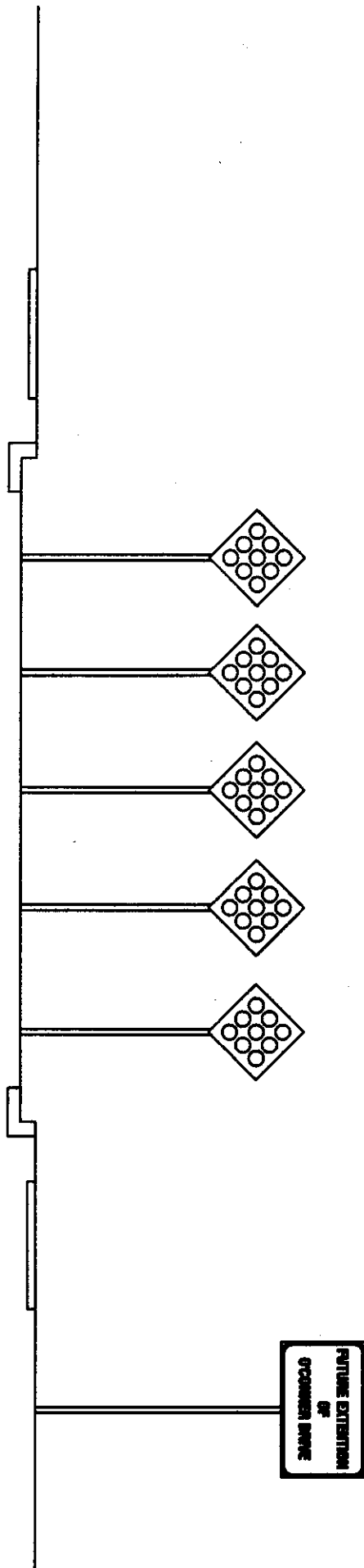

According to the March 28, 1997 ATS transportation plan map, all or a portion of the following roads has not yet been constructed:

1. Anderson Mill Road
2. SH 45
3. Lakeline Blvd. (Neeah Blvd.)
4. Davis Springs Road. (O'Conner Dr.)
5. New Hope Road
6. CR 272
7. Buttercup Drive
8. US 183A
9. Howard Lane
10. Wyoming Springs
11. Loop 1
12. CR 122
13. CR 114
14. Creek Bend Blvd. (Brightwater/Fern Bluff)

Attached is a conceptual drawing of what could be done at the temporary end of these streets. The five signs in the street are the typical barricade that we are currently using. The informational sign would be located within the right-of-way just beyond the sidewalk. The informational sign would be similar to those signs used by TxDOT marking the limits of their maintenance.

RESOLUTION

IN SUPPORT OF

INMATE REIMBURSEMENT LEGISLATION

The Commissioners Court of Williamson County, Texas meeting in special session of the 26th day of May, 1998 considered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, Williamson County taxpayers are burdened with the high costs of providing food, clothing, shelter, medical and other expenses for persons convicted of criminal wrongdoing, when many have the ability to pay all or a portion of their per diem costs of confinement; and,

WHEREAS, Sixteen (16) States in the USA have statutes that enable Counties to charge jail inmates per diem costs; and,

WHEREAS, legislation is needed in Texas requiring jail inmates to reimburse the county for all or a portion of the daily incarceration costs.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Commissioners Court of the County of Williamson, Texas, that Williamson County supports legislation which would recover costs from jail inmates convicted of crime. The costs of incarceration should be borne by those whose conduct has earned it rather than by taxpayers.
