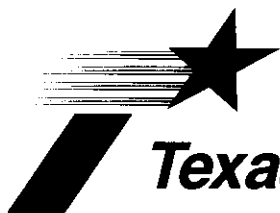

Dear Judge Doerfler:

This letter is to inform you that the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) has selected the bridge at CR 371 and Willis Creek in the Williamson County for replacement under the Off-System Federal-Aid Bridge Replacement and Rehabilitation Program (HBRRP). The proposed improvements include replacing the existing structure with a new structure. Under the HBRRP, the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) funds 80 percent of the project construction amount, TxDOT funds 10 percent, and the local entity funds 10 percent. The local entities also have responsibility for acquiring any right-of-way that may be needed, and all required utility adjustments.

The latest construction estimate for this project is \$220,000, which means the Williamson County's estimated participation is \$22,000, plus 10 percent of design engineering, construction engineering, and indirect Department costs. As you may be aware, this dollar figure is an estimate only, and your actual costs will be 10 percent of the above referenced items upon completion of the project.

This project is currently scheduled for letting in Fiscal Year 1999. If Williamson County would like to participate in this project, please respond to me at the above listed address.
