

Commissioner Hays was interested in a report on the number of papers being served out of the offices of the constables.

Commissioner Mehevec discussed the excessive fees for service of some type papers. Restraining orders require a \$40.00 service fee. A \$100.00 court cost fee was also discussed.

County Engineer Joe England had contacted City of Georgetown and TNRCC regarding fees to pave lot north of the jail. The City of Georgetown was uncomfortable with placing base with compaction fearing additional run off but felt o.k. with open graded rock and fill.

TNRCC would definitely require Williamson County to go through the permitting process if we use any base. They would approve maintenance with open graded rock.

The TNRCC permitting process would entail a minimum of 90 days plus a few thousand dollars for fees.

County Attorney Gene Taylor advised a revision in their office for efficiency. When calling for Dale speak to Helen advising what information is required.


