where, among other matters, came up for consideration and adoption the following:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Williamson County has the right to control and use its right-of-way for the purpose of intercepting and conveying rainfall runoff from land adjacent to its roads; and

WHEREAS, The agricultural community in Williamson County along with the United States Department of Agriculture Natural Resources Conservation Service (USDA-NRCS) has on various occasions modified drainage patterns that have had a negative impact on county roads; and

WHEREAS, The Williamson County Commissioners Court desires that, for the safety and economic welfare of its citizens, and to help eliminate future occurrences, a written permission or working agreement be obtained from Williamson County.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Williamson County Commissioners Court demands that the agricultural community in Williamson County along with the United States Department of Agriculture Natural Resources Conservation Service follow the procedures as set forth in STX502.03 *Permission or working agreement to empty terraces in road ditches* for the good and safety of not only the citizens of Williamson County but of all citizens who traverse the roads of Williamson County.

WHEREUPON A MOTION MADE by ~~Commissioner Mehever~~ and seconded by ~~Judge Doerfler~~ the Court did vote to adopt this Resolution and authorize the County Judge to sign this Resolution as an ACT and DEED of the Williamson County Commissioners Court and the Clerk was instructed to record the Resolution in the Official Minutes. and at said meeting, among other business, the Court considered the following

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the citizens of the Republic of Texas in 1845, in order to insure the continued blessing of liberty for themselves and their posterity, welcomed the admission of the Republic of Texas as the 28th state of the United States of America when James K. Polk, the 11th president of the United States signed the Joint Resolution of Congress for Texas Statehood on December 29, 1845; and

WHEREAS, on February 19, 1846 members of the first legislature of the State of Texas and other officials gathered together with citizens in front of the wood-planked capitol building on Hickory (8th) and Colorado streets in the City of Austin to witness Dr. Anson Jones, the last president of the Republic of Texas, lower the Lone Star flag for the last time and raise the flag of the United States of America to the top of the mast, and see James Pickney Henderson sworn in as the first governor of the State of Texas; and


WHEREAS, Governor George W. Bush, of the state of Texas, has for the last three years proclaimed the 19th of February as the

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Commissioners' Court of Williamson County, Texas does hereby memorialize the 76th Texas Legislature meeting in 1999 to establish the STATE OF TEXAS ANNIVERSARY REMEMBRANCE (S.T.A.R.) DAY as Special Observation Day on the 19th day of February each year to observe the birthday of the State of Texas and celebrate the rich history and diverse heritage of the people of the State of Texas.
