Commissioner Boatright advised two to two-and-one-half million dollar bond was issued for Brushy Creek Road located between Parmer Lane and Great Oaks Drive which improvements will consist of widening the shoulders along with re-surfacing. The majority of that portion of Brushy Creek Road is located in the flood plane and O'Connor Drive will become the major tie between Brushy Creek Road and Parmer Lane and eventually run all the way to 183. The section between Cedar Park and Parmer Lane is a major arterial.

First Assistant County Attorney Dale Rye advised the exact wording would determine where the funds could be utilized.

Commissioner Boatright will request clarification from bond council Fulbright and Jaworski since the majority of the monies are required between Parmer Lane and the City of Cedar Park.
