Be it remembered at a regular meeting of the Commissioners Court of WILLIAMSON County, Texas, held on the 9 day of FEB., 1999, on a motion made by MIKE HEILIGENSTEIN and seconded by DAVID HAYS the following order was adopted:

Whereas, The Texas Conference of Urban Counties is an advocate for the interests of Texas counties affected by metropolitan growth, and

Whereas, The Texas Conference of Urban Counties has taken a leading role in preserving county subdivision regulation authority and county platting statutes, and

Whereas, WILLIAMSON County has a responsibility to protect the health and general welfare of its citizens by responsibly administering state laws to insure that development in unincorporated areas considers the basic needs of county residents for adequate access, drainage, and services, now

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED by the WILLIAMSON County Commissioners Court that payment is authorized to the Texas Conference of Urban Counties in the amount of \$1,000 in order to provide extra resources to assist the CUC staff in performing its duties to the CUC in support of county subdivision regulation and platting authority.
