Consider approving intergovernmental agreement with City of Taylor for construction of road at the Taylor Airport.

Commissioner Limmer advised the City of Taylor has paid approximately \$1,044,723.00 to date for Taylor Airport expansion. Since County Road 398 will require re-routing to the north the city is requesting the county also accept responsibility of southern expansion of County Road 398. This is phase one according to plans by Turner Collie and Braden Engineering with cost estimate of approximately \$700,000.00. This phase does not include installation of water lines or bridge.

Commissioner Boatright requested the County Attorney review the proposed intergovernmental agreement before any signatures are affixed. Also he felt if Williamson County contributes the funds the City of Taylor shall be responsible for all material, equipment, labor, fuel, engineering, supervision and any and all other expenses and responsibilities involved in the road construction.

First Assistant County Attorney Dale Rye suggested the agreement state that all right, title and interest of Williamson County in the remaining east end of County Road 398 off FM 397 be abandoned to the City of Taylor.

Also discussed was the \$700,000.00 be paid from cash ending balance with reimbursement from possible future issuance of \$20m Certificates of Obligation.

Seconded: Commissioner Boatright

Motion: To approve interlocal agreement with the City of Taylor who accepts full responsibility for all necessary arrangements regarding County Road 398 after Williamson County contributes up to \$700,000.00 and dedicates the short eastern end of County Road 398 off FM 397 to City of Taylor contingent upon review by Williamson County Attorney.

Commissioner Boatright withdrew his second to the motion.

Motion failed for lack of second.

No action was taken on this item which will be added to the agenda of November 16, 1999.
