PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the health of the residents of Williamson County is linked to the health of all the people throughout the World; and

WHEREAS, April 5-11, 1999 has been established as Public Health Week-an occasion to educate and inform, to encourage increased community health education and to focus on leading healthier lifestyles, and

WHEREAS, the Williamson County & Cities Health District's mission to promote and protect the health of the people of Williamson County can only be accomplished by the whole community working together; and

WHEREAS, during 1998 the Health District protected our environment and our food by inspecting over 850 food establishments at least four times during the year, by inspecting over 3,500 septic systems, and by training over 7,000 food handlers; and

WHEREAS, the health District's Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) program issued over 38,400 food vouchers to improve the health of women and children, and the use of these vouchers brought over \$2,765,000 million in purchase to local grocery stores; and

WHEREAS, Health District staff administered over 22,500 immunizations, assisted nearly 800 women with prenatal care, and referred over 6,300 county residents to needed community services;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT PROCLAIMED that the Williamson County Commissioner's Court does hereby declare April 5-11, 1999 as

PUBLIC HEALTH WEEK

and urge all residents of Williamson County to recognize the staff and volunteers of our public health district for their successes in maintaining and improving the health of their fellow citizens.

Hear Ted Hejl of Taylor Airport Board concerning County Road 398 and take any appropriate action.

Taylor City Attorney Ted Hejl displayed an overview map of the Taylor Airport proposed runway expansion from 3,500' to 4,000' and explained the demand for general aviation facilities (airports).

The City of Taylor has invested \$250,000.00 acquiring property north of the airport which will eventually expand the runway to 5,000'.

The City is offering to cooperate with the county to build a new road west of Highway 95 looping west of the airport with dead end at Mustang Creek. County Road 398 would be absorbed into the airport.
