1. When clearing right-of-way, all trees other than Cedar, Hackberry and Chinaberry shall be trimmed using a chain saw and using proper pruning techniques.
2. Before trimming oak trees (Red Oak, Pin Oak or Live Oak) the chain saw blade is to be washed with a minimum of 10% Clorox/90% water solution. ALL OAK cuts will then be painted with tree paint.
3. The bat wing cutting blade should only be used on Cedar, Hackberry, Chinaberry trees and vines within county right-of-way.
4. Commissioner of the precinct in which the right-of-way is being cleared should be notified for approval prior to clearing and trimming.
