


THAT Williamson County, Texas (County), and the Jollyville Volunteer Fire Department (Department), an incorporated volunteer fire department as describes in V.A.T.C., LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE, 352.001(c), have entered into the following

AGREEMENT

1. Pursuant to its power to provide financial assistance for fire protection in and for Williamson County, and its duty to protect the public health and welfare, the County agrees to pay to the Department the sum of \$ 39,322.00, in two (2) payments. The first payment being made within the county has received a signed agreement accompanied by a detailed accounting of the past year's expenditures of the county allotment. The second payment will be disbursed on or before September 30, 1999. All funds are to be used to defray the cost of equipment and labor required to provide the services described in Paragraph 2.
2. The Department agrees to provide fire protection services in any area in the County when requested by any other fire company, or when dispatched by the County, and shall expend all of the amount set forth in Paragraph 1 for only these purposes during calendar year 1999.
3. It is understood by the City that the County cannot commit funds for any future fiscal year, and that this Agreement does not, and cannot, commit the County to renew or repeat this Agreement unless approved by future action of the Williamson County Commissioners' Court.
4. it is understood and agreed that the County as no power to control or supervise the manner and means chosen by the Department to carry out the services specified in Paragraph 2, and that the County shall have no liability for any intentional acts of the Department which are not related to the provision of said services. The Department further agrees to indemnify the County for any loss or expense (including but not limited to attorneys' fees) incurred as a result of any claim against the County by any person or entity, should such claim be based upon any intentional act or omission by the Department which is not related to the provision of the services described in Paragraph 2.

JOLLYVILLE VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT 1998 BUDGET and EXPENDITURES

The 1998 adopted budget for the fire department was:	\$654,020.00
The actual total 1998 expenses for the fire department were:	\$638,153.68

Funds received from Williamson County in 1998 were \$39,272.00. This amounts to 6.15% of the total fire department expenses. These funds are actually assimilated with other department funds. All Jollyville Volunteer Fire Department emergency calls are within Williamson County with the exception of a few requested mutual aid calls to fire departments in Travis County. Therefore, 6.15% of all our expenses could be considered paid for with the County funding.

The fire department would like to thank you, your staff and the Commissioners Court for your continued support of fire protection and emergency medical first responder services in our area. Your assistance helps us provide prompt, quality service to the 30,000 plus County residents in the Jollyville Volunteer Fire Department response area.

WHEREAS, Block House Venture, as the owner of that certain 341.476 acre tract of land in the S. J. Dover Survey, Abstract No. 168, situated in Williamson County, Texas, conveyed by deed recorded in Volume 1220, Page 770 of the Deed Records of Williamson County, Texas, did heretofore Grant, Convey and Dedicate to Williamson County, Texas, that certain 6.751 acre tract of land for the purpose of public right-of-way, known locally as Block House Drive, per Right-of-Way Dedication instrument recorded in Volume 1473, Page 917 of the Deed Records of Williamson County, Texas, and

WHEREAS, Continental Homes of Texas, L.P., a Texas limited partnership is now the owner of those certain lands adjacent to said 6.751 acre Right-of-Way Dedication, per deed recorded in Document No. 9557956 of the Deed Records of Williamson County, Texas, and

WHEREAS, Milburn Investments, Inc. has provided for alternative access to Block House Drive by virtue of the plat of Block House Creek Phase F, Section Two, and such alternative access has eliminated the need for a 0.027 acre portion of said Block House Drive, and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners' Court of Williamson County, Texas, is now desirous of vacating said 0.027 acre portion of said dedicated right-of-way, which is located along the Southeast side of Block House Drive, and which, by non-use, is no longer needed as right-of-way, to wit:

All of that certain 0.027 acre portion of right-of-way, as described in EXHIBIT "A", attached hereto and made a part hereof for all purposes;

so as to destroy the force and effect of the dedication of said 0.027 acre portion of right-of-way.

THAT I, John C. Doerfler, County Judge of Williamson County, Texas, do hereby certify that this instrument, with written Field Notes attached hereto as EXHIBIT "A", having been duly presented to the Commissioners' Court of Williamson County, Texas, and by said Court was duly considered, was on this day approved, and do hereby declare that certain 0.027 acre portion of right-of-way, as described in said EXHIBIT "A", to be vacated.
