Dear Ms. Ginny Atkinson

Thank you for allowing San Antonio Ambulance Sales, Inc. the opportunity of bidding on you're proposed ambulance air conditioner/heater retrofit bid.

San Antonio Ambulance Sales, Inc. represents "Hoseline Inc.", the largest manufacturer of ambulance air conditioning systems in the country. The air conditioning system that they recommend for this type of installation is the 15,000 BTU air system with Freon # 22, and a 5,500-watt heat strip.

Freon # 22, is an approved Freon type used for 120-volt systems, Freon 134a is normally not used for this application. We do take this EXCEPTION. With the space constraints we will use a 15,000 BTU unit. And will assure that this will meet the requirement of the contract.

Our heater being installed is in excess of the 1,250 watt being asked for; we are offering a 5,500-watt unit. Our Texas winters often require this higher output to obtain the heating required to maintain the temperature needed to protect sensitive drugs.



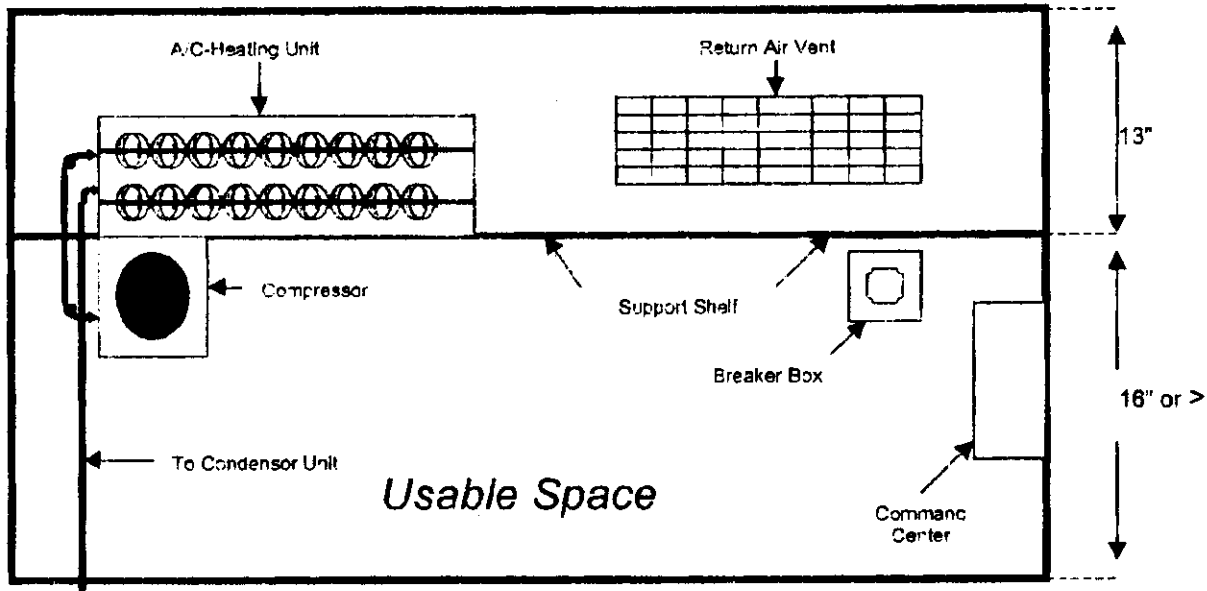

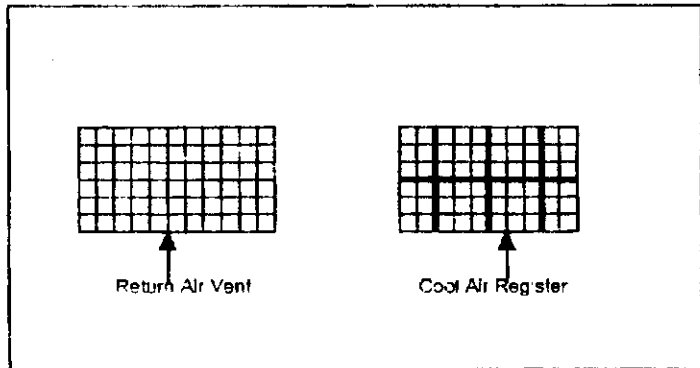

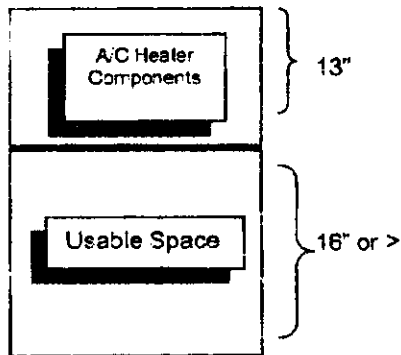


Rear View of A/C Unit

The area that encompasses the A/C-Heating unit and Return Air Vent will be sealed from the outside environment with a removable/hinged door for access to unit for servicing or filter change-out. The condenser unit will be mounted underneath the ambulance box with a minimum of 5' ft to rear of condenser as per manufacturer of system.

15 or more 120v Ambulance Air Conditioner/Heater System**

The bidder will furnish and install 15 or more 120 volt air conditioners/heaters on current Williamson County EMS ambulances.

Specifications

General:

- The air conditioner/heaters will be mounted in the left rear, street-side skirt compartment.
- The air conditioner intake duct and directional vents will be mounted through the lower action wall; this will eliminate the loss of any interior cabinet space. (See attached drawings).
- The shoreline will be utilized for the 120-volt power. Most all the ambulances currently have the 20-amp shoreline in place.
- Suitable length shoreline cord will be provided with each unit.
- It is bidder's responsibility to insure that the shoreline matches the need for the 120-volt power (minimum of 30 amp).
- The area that encompasses the A/C-Heating unit and Return Air Vent will be sealed from the outside with a hinged/removable door for access to unit for filter change-out.
- Temperature control thermostat and fan speed switch to be mounted on wall of Action Shelf in patient compartment.
- All holes cut in the compartment to the exterior environment will be sealed with a material suitable to prevent the introduction of dust or moisture.
- Installation of these ambulance air conditioner/heaters to be done "on location" in Williamson County.

Air Conditioners:

- 18,000 BTU
- Utilize R134a ozone-safe Freon, to allow for same servicing as factory ambulance air conditioner
- Condenser will be 12 volt
- Powered through a battery charger/conditioner.
- Battery charger/conditioner will be large enough to insure proper maintenance of ambulance batteries.
- Location of battery charger/conditioner will be in the compartment below the A/C-Heater unit.
- All freon hoses will be constructed of same material as automobile freon hoses.
- The condenser unit will be mounted underneath the ambulance box with a minimum of 5° tilt to rear of condenser per manufacturer of system.

Heater:

- Minimum of 1,250 watts
- Heating element will be made of stainless steel.

All work will be warranted for a period of one (1) year.

These ambulances are available for inspection at the EMS Main office at 303 Martin Luther King St., Georgetown, Texas. The inspections can be conducted by calling (512) 943-1264 for an appointment. Jeff Hayes, Director of Operations will assist in coordinating inspection.




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COUNTY OF WILLIAMSON

THAT Williamson County, Texas (County), and the Thrall Volunteer Fire Department (Department), an incorporated volunteer fire department as describes in V.A.T.C., LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE, 352.001(c), have entered into the following

AGREEMENT

1. Pursuant to its power to provide financial assistance for fire protection in and for Williamson County, and its duty to protect the public health and welfare, the County agrees to pay to the Department the sum of \$ 25,781.00, in two (2) payments. The first payment being made within the county has received a signed agreement accompanied by a detailed accounting of the past year's expenditures of the county allotment. The second payment will be disbursed on or before September 30, 1999. All funds are to be used to defray the cost of equipment and labor required to provide the services described in Paragraph 2.
2. The Department agrees to provide fire protection services in any area in the County when requested by any other fire company, or when dispatched by the County, and shall expend all of the amount set forth in Paragraph 1 for only these purposes during calendar year 1999.
3. It is understood by the City that the County cannot commit funds for any future fiscal year, and that this Agreement does not, and cannot, commit the County to renew or repeat this Agreement unless approved by future action of the Williamson County Commissioners' Court.
4. It is understood and agreed that the County has no power to control or supervise the manner and means chosen by the Department to carry out the services specified in Paragraph 2, and that the County shall have no liability for any intentional acts of the Department which are not related to the provision of said services. The Department further agrees to indemnify the County for any loss or expense (including but not limited to attorneys' fees) incurred as a result of any claim against the County by any person or entity, should such claim be based upon any intentional act or omission by the Department which is not related to the provision of the services described in Paragraph 2.
