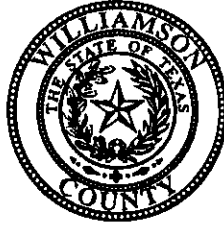

Ladies and Gentlemen:

I would like to propose to you a request from my office for monies to be used to purchase equipment for a Bicycle Patrol for the Constable's Office. We are working on an Inter-Agency agreement with Taylor Police Department to form a Bike Patrol that can be coordinated by both agencies to serve the community.

We are currently utilizing a Bike Patrol to concentrate efforts to promote bicycle safety, through bicycle rodeos for our children. We also work large functions, such as the Taylor Rattlesnake Roundup, Taylor Rodeo, Taylor Bar B Que, cook off, Granger Lake Fest and general policing patrol efforts in the Taylor, eastside area. We are also working with the Granger Lake Park Ranger's to patrol the trails inaccessible by conventional transportation. All of the functions are provided free of charge to the community. In other words, we do not charge for security, we come to serve you the public.

Turn Around Taylor has seen the Constable's Office participating recently, and we would like to incorporate the Bicycle Patrol in this endeavor. Also we are trying to plan ahead for the patrol concerns coming with the new 160-acre park in the southeast portion of Taylor.

Part of the interagency agreement will be to support Taylor Police Department with their Bike Patrol activities as we are needed, and that Taylor will reciprocate to our office. It will also allow both departments to train together, and provide a safer effective patrol. As you can guess it's all hanging out on the line while on a bike, there's no car to protect you, and no V-8 motor to speed you away. Please take this into consideration on the costs of these bicycles. These are not the most expensive available to Law Enforcement, but are the most practical, and dependable.
