



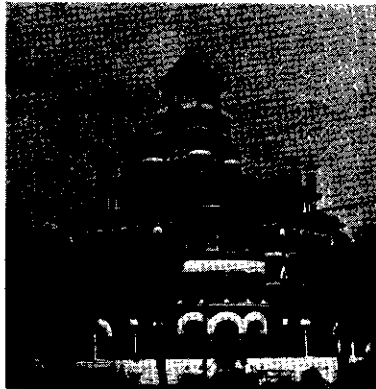

Dear Commissioner Boatright:

I would like to request that the Williamson County Commissioners Court consider an action to abandon the right-of-way for East Street north of East Evans Street in Leander, Texas. To my knowledge, this segment of right-of-way has never been used for a public road since the late 1800's (when the town was laid out by the railroad).


I have spoken to relatives of the original property owners that purchased all of the lots within Blocks 1 and 2 of the town, and they have stated that this area has always been fenced as part of the overall property. I have included herewith, a letter from my neighbor -- Mrs. Peggy Simpson, who is a grandchild of the original owners in which she states that this roadway has always been fenced during her lifetime (I believe that she was born in 1939).

I have also included a copy of the City of Leander utility map which shows that the current city limit runs along the west side of East Street which means that this right-of-way is within the County's jurisdiction. Also included is a map from the city's digital map files that shows the area to be abandon and the general outline of the fenced property. A copy of the original township map is enclosed to show the limits of the right-of-way.

I hope that this request can be placed on the next commissioners court agenda and that the court will act favorable on this request. If you need any additional information from me, please fell free to call me.
