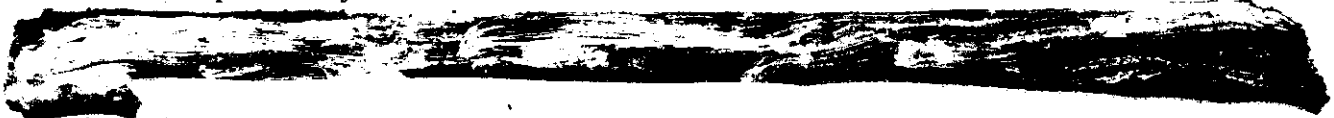
Mr. Darrell Champeau of Cedar Park addressed the court regarding Hog Farm Park - see attached statement.

On September 21, 1999 the minutes on agenda #1 states....."Darrell Champeau discussed Hog Farm Park which has been managed by the YMCA and is now open to the public" Really? This is a sign that I uprooted in the park this morning. It faced a path from the Kent Street sub-division closing the entire park to that subdivisions 20 or so children who would now have to go on busy highway 183 to get to the park entrance if that gate wasn't locked. Which it is, of course. **READ SIGN** →

There is a also a sign on the usually locked gate saying that the park is temporarily closed for maintenance and the date is changed weekly to close it at all times not needed by the Y which is nearly always. There is little maintenance going on. This sign calls it the YMCA park. A bold faced lie.

To the recording secretary I ask that I be quoted extensively as I am preparing for a lawsuit on this issue and I am profoundly deaf.



Is the Y thumbing it's nose at this Court?.....or Is this Court thumbing it's nose at Texas Parks and Wildlife? Clouding the issue using security is the a huge joke! I bought the Sheriff incidents reports from 1994 to 1999 in that park there was some of course but you have made ~~EXAGGERATED~~ allegations that remind me **OF A LONDON FOG.**

But it is mismanagement and lack of control and TxDot, TxP&W and ~~that~~ this court knew or should have known the Y's intentions to lock the general public out in real or de-facto terms.

Commissioner Boatright advised the park has been closed temporarily for treatment of duckweed. Three (3) applications are required and after each treatment the park is closed 3 to 5 days to prevent the public from being exposed to the chemicals in the lake. The treatments are being scheduled during the week in order for the park to open on the week-ends. The last treatment is scheduled for next week.

Signs on perimeter are designed to control access & utilize main entrance only. Concerning temporary closure, this is necessary due to treating the duckweed in the lakes. This treatment requires three (3) applications. The park must be closed 3 to 5 days after each treatment and is timed to allow the park to be open on the weekends during this interim period. ~~217~~
