Judge Doerfler introduced new Round Rock City Council member Isabel Gallahan.

Land Strategies, Inc. Pix Howell discussed receipt of the \$850,000.00 Brushy Creek Trail grant from Texas Parks and Wildlife Department suggesting construction begin before the end of the year 2000. He distributed an optimistic schedule advising approximately \$100,000.00 would be needed for survey, design, engineering, etc. for which grant funds could not be spent.

Mr. Howell will bring breakdown on costs and maps to next meeting for which Commissioner Heiligenstein proposed an agenda item considering an agreement for professional services relating to surveying and design for Brushy Creek Trail, Phase 1A. The commissioner suggested consideration of allocation of \$33,333.00 from Precincts 1, 2 and 3 Certificates of Obligation to defer the cost.

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
