Hear comments from commissioners

Commissioner Boatright discussed right-of-way on Farm-to-Market 620 in the Lakeline Mall area which has been annexed by and is now inside the city limits of the City of Austin . The Simon Group has plans to build soon and will set-back 100 feet. If the City of Austin does not purchase the additional 200 feet for right-of-way soon the opportunity will be lost Also, the City of Cedar Park has opposed the alignment of State Highway 183A and Texas Turnpike Authority has withdrawn their proposed public hearing for the realignment from Farm-to-Market 1325 to the county line. City of Cedar Park's opposition to the realignment is due to the loss of most of their commercial property with the only option being re-routing through Anderson Mill destroying between 120 and 150 homes.


A public hearing regarding 183-A has been set for January 22, 2000 – proposed routing from just north of Leander to just north of Farm-to-Market 620.
