Dear Judge Doerfler:

This is a request for the county's appointment of an individual to serve on the steering committee being formed for the purpose of guiding the study project referenced above. The project will focus on a study area of primarily Williamson County and would develop both short and long-range transit options for this rapidly urbanizing area.

A steering committee made up of representatives from the Austin District of TxDOT and all participating local governments in the study area would assist CARTS in directing the project. The participating jurisdictions include Williamson County, and the cities of Round Rock, Georgetown, Taylor and Cedar Park. Representatives of the Capital Area MPO and Capital Metro may be invited to participate in an advisory role as needed to ensure coordination with efforts now underway or planned by those entities.

We have scheduled the first meeting for 10:00 a.m., Wednesday, November 7th at the Round Rock Station, the CARTS facility located at 402 W. Bowman in Round Rock. This will be an organizational meeting wherein we together determine the committee's role in the process and discuss the scope of the project. Additional information will be forthcoming as the date gets closer.


It is further ordered that the polling place listed below will be open from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., November 6, 2001, for voting.
