PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the health of Williamson County communities is linked to the health and well-being of all the people throughout the County; and

WHEREAS, April 2-8, 2001 has been established as National Public Health Week-an occasion to educate and inform, to encourage increased community health education; and

WHEREAS, the Williamson County & Cities Health District's mission to promote and protect the health of the people of Williamson County can only be accomplished by working together; and

WHEREAS, the Williamson County & Cities Health District inspected over 850 food establishments and 4,896 septic systems and trained 7,856 food handlers during 2000 as a way of protecting our environment and our food; and

WHEREAS, the Williamson County & Cities Health District promoted good nutrition to women, infants and children through 42,323 visits to the WIC program and issued vouchers redeemed for food worth \$2,876,000 at local grocery stores; now

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Williamson County Commissioner's Court declares the week of April 2-8, 2001 as

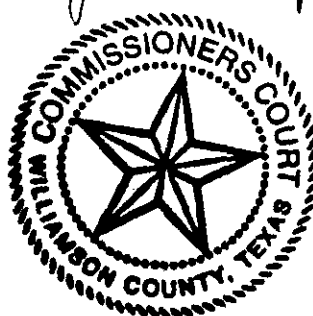


