Comments from commissioners.

Commissioner Boatright stated that the discussion on the jail project and contract was helpful and that everyone is ready to move forward and start construction.

Commissioner Hays mentioned that Georgetown and Round Rock are interested in using the soccer fields on the Mayfield tract.

Della Green of Georgetown inquired about the jail expansion project and the commissioners' plans for it, and asked how many of the prisoners housed there were state prisoners being held at the present facility. She mentioned that the current jail expansion plan is in an "urban renewal" area, and that some residents of the neighborhood would be disproportionately affected by the location.

Judge Doerfler stated that the current jail population consists of county prisoners only and that there are county prisoners housed in Taylor due to overcrowding at the current facility, and that the commissioners having looked at several possible sites, had decided that the current site is the most feasible.
