June 1936	Old Laneport not in excess of 14% alcohol by volume
Nov 1944	Last JOP #7 election Gus Adams
Nov 1946	JOP #7 consolidated into JOP #6 with no one running
Nov 1972	JOP #3 approves beer off premise consumption
Jan 1973	JOP #1 prohibits beer off premise consumption
Feb 1974	Court ordered redistricting causes re-alignment of JOP #1
Nov 1974	All alcoholic beverages except mixed beverages in Cedar Park
Feb 1977	"Failed" to legalize sale of beer and wine in JOP #1
Aug 1977	All alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages in Thrall
May 1979	Beer for off-premise consumption in JOP #1
April 1983	Beer for off-premise consumption in Round Rock
June 1983	All alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages in Round Rock
