***PROCLAMATION  
INSURE A KID AWARENESS WEEK  
February 11<sup>th</sup>-15<sup>th</sup>, 2002***

**WHEREAS**, every child should have an opportunity to receive quality health care to insure their future no matter what their economic circumstances, and;

**WHEREAS**, uninsured children are 25% more likely to miss school, six times more likely to go without medical care, and five times more likely to use the emergency room as a singular source of health care than insured children, and;

**WHEREAS**, the Insure-a-Kid program's mission is to increase the number of children in Travis and Williamson counties enrolled in Medicaid and the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP), and;


**WHEREAS**, February 11<sup>th</sup> to February 15<sup>th</sup> has been established as "Insure-a-Kid Awareness Week," an occasion to educate, inform, and to encourage increased community awareness on health care coverage for children;

**THEREFORE, I, JOHN C. *Whereas,* A.C. Berry, Jr. supervises 34 probation officers, parole officers and support staff who serve in a variety of programs, along with the Services to At-Risk and Runaway Youth Program, or S.T.A.R.R.Y., for youth involved in deferred prosecution cases; and

*Whereas,* A.C. Berry, Jr. established and implemented the case management system currently being used by all juvenile probation officers in the County; and

*Whereas,* A.C. Berry, Jr. serves on the Round Rock YMCA Advisory Board, Williamson County Big Brothers/Big Sisters Advisory Council, Advisory Council for S.T.A.R.R.Y and he serves as vice chairman for the Community Resource Coordination Group and President of the Children's Support Coalition; and

*Whereas,* A.C. Berry, Jr. has recently been recognized by his peers for modeling an "exemplary management style that offers those who work with him the opportunity to reach their greatest potential" and calling him "an ambassador in the field of juvenile justice",
