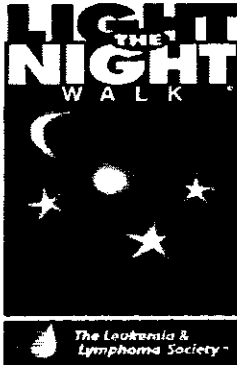


RESOLVED, That through the adoption of this resolution of the 76th Legislature of the State of Texas as a token of high regard for the 76th Legislature of the State of Texas.
