**RESOLUTION NO. \_\_\_\_\_****A RESOLUTION OF THE WILLIAMSON COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT SUPPORTING AN EXPANSION OF THE WILLIAMSON COUNTY LANDFILL**

**WHEREAS**, a Texas resident generates more than 7.5 pounds of trash daily, according to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ);

**WHEREAS**, Williamson County experienced a 79 percent growth rate from 1990 to 2000, the largest in the region and the 2<sup>nd</sup> largest in the state of Texas, and the population is expected to increase from 249,967 in 2000 to 449,652 by the year 2020 and 724,667 by the year 2040 in Williamson County;


**WHEREAS**, the Williamson County landfill is a Type I municipal solid waste landfill (TCEQ Permit Number MSW 1405A) owned by Williamson County and operated by Waste Management of Texas, which employs Best Management Practices to protect surface water and groundwater, air quality and overall environmental conditions;

**WHEREAS**, it is the intent of the Commissioners to ensure that Williamson County can meet the future waste needs of its residents and businesses in an economical and efficient manner, while considering regional development and planning; and

**WHEREAS**, the County owns land around the landfill what will provide for appropriate lateral and vertical expansions at the existing site, providing the proper waste management infrastructure for years to come;

**THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Williamson County Commissioners Court hereby supports in full the pursuit of an expansion of Williamson County Landfill by Waste Management of Texas.
